THE POWER OF ATTENTION

[p180] In reality I don't think it is healthy to be obsessed with spiritual warfare, angels, demons, curses, and the devil.

[p181] If our eyes, hearts, and minds are on Jesus, then we will be conformed into His image.

[p182] Whatever you focus on, whatever you give your attention to, is what will grow in your life.

[p182] One of Satan's most powerful weapons is fear.

[p182] The antidote to fear is love, which comes from God.

[p182] If you are focused on the demonic, fear will rule your life. This is not from God. If you focus on God, love will rule your heart.

SAFETY IN NUMBERS

[p183] First, it is important that you are plugged in to a spiritual community.

[p183] The second takeaway is this: make sure you are looking out for your brothers and sisters in Christ the way you want them to look out for you.

WALKING IN FORGIVENESS

[p187] Unforgiveness is steeped in self-righteousness. This is one reason unforgiveness blocks the grace of God—because self-righteousness is a form of pride, and God resists the proud but gives grace to the humble.

[p187] When you hold resentment and animosity in your heart, you condemn yourself to a prison of torment.

[p188] This root of bitterness has blocked the blessing of God from flowing into their lives on every level and has given the enemy a legitimate stronghold.
